Exam Information

Post Results Services

For each examination series the awarding bodies offer a number of Post Results Services. These are:

Clerical checks

• This is a re-check of all clerical procedures leading to the issue of a result.

• Reviews of marking

 This is a post-results review of the original marking to ensure that the agreed mark scheme has been applied correctly. <u>It is not a re-marking of the candidate's script</u>.

• Priority Reviews of marking

- This is a post-results review of the original marking to ensure that the agreed mark scheme has been applied correctly. It is not a re-marking of the candidate's script.
- It is only available if a GCE A-level candidate's place in higher education is dependent on the outcome.

Reviews of moderation

This is a review of the original moderation to ensure that the assessment criteria have been fairly, reliably and consistently applied. It is not a re-moderation of candidates' work.

Access to scripts

Centres may request:

- Copies of scripts to support reviews of marking which will be provided to centres.
- Copies of scripts to support teaching and learning.

Fees

There is a cost for each of these services which must be paid at the time of submitting the request. Details of the cost will be provided with the results on results days.

Application form for a Post Results Service (PRS)

Post Results Services are only available via the school. Direct applications to an awarding body are not permitted. An application form for a PRS will be available from the Exams Office from results days onwards.

Deadlines

All requests for a PRS are subject to very strict deadlines. These will be detailed on the application form. Extensions beyond the deadline are not possible.

Outcome of enquires

The outcome of a PRS will be notified to the school by the awarding body. Notification (usually by email) will then be sent to the student.

Appeals

There is an appeals process should the school remain dissatisfied with the outcome on enquiry about results. This will only consider whether the agreed process and procedures have been applied by the awarding body. It will not normally result in a re-mark of the exam script. All appeals must be made by the school and are subject to very strict deadlines.
